Containment of the virus with disinfection measures



Rieter showed to the inhabitants of the villages Wing and Gokwadi during the lockdown period how the spread of the virus can be minimized with hygiene measures. Disinfection treatments were carried out in 1'800 households, temples, schools and common rooms. This helped in preventing to a large extent the spread of COVID-19 cases in these localities.

Organ donation session was conducted at Adarsha Vidyalaya High School in Shirwal, district Satara, jointly by Rieter and Federation of Organ and Body Donation, Mumbai.
